

Is there a negative EV stereotype?

A Traditional, affective-based negative stereotype exists, despite reflecting outdated associations with milk floats and older EV models. However, the current period of widespread EV trialling in the UK sees the emergence of additional EV stereotypes.

Are EV drivers stereotyping?

Drivers in the United Kingdom Technology Strategy Board funded Ultra Low Carbon Vehicle trial were interviewed regarding their interactions with the general (non-EV driving) public. EV drivers' accounts suggest that EVs are particularly susceptible to stereotyping, but that the stereotyping is in a state of flux.

Are EVs a stereotype?

The Traditional stereotype was not consistent but comprised at least two, conflicting representations of EVs, as some people perceived them to be technologically crude and backward, while others imagined them as problematically high-tech and 'geeky'.

Are stereotypes a barrier to BEV adoption?

It uses a qualitative approach to investigate a psychological barrier to BEV adoption, and focuses on stereotype threat linked to real-world social identities that individuals can choose to adopt or not adopt (in this case, BEV drivers, environmentalists, and technophiles).

What are the different types of stereotype threat?

Individuals may experience different kinds of stereotype threat, ranging from a brief sense of apprehension linked to a specific activity to a continuous 'engulfing predicament' over a long time period (Steele et al., 2002, p. 385).
