

Are your RV batteries dying?

If your RV batteries are dying and you are convinced it's not due to usage, then you should turn your attention to the state of the batteries themselves. Testing with a multimeter or hooking up a battery monitor will give you a better understanding of their current charge level and performance.

First, check the voltage with a multimeter to test if you have a discharged battery. If you have a voltage ranging from 13.3v to 12v, that battery is considered charged and should not be causing battery issues.

Do new RV batteries work?

Some have a longer battery life, but if brand new, the expectation should be that they work properly with your RV. Your RV battery is the main power source for most RV appliances and lights. A dead battery puts you in a tough spot to operate your RV, even when connected to shore power.

How long do RV batteries typically last?

Deep-cycle flooded lead-acid RV batteries typically last around 6 years when they are properly maintained. If your RV battery is more than 6 years old and you've maintained it and never discharged it past 80%, there is a good chance the battery is past its prime and ready to be replaced.
