

Where is Equatorial Guinea located?

Equatorial Guinea,[a]officially the Republic of Equatorial Guinea,[b]is a country on the west coast of Central Africa,with an area of 28,000 square kilometres (11,000 sq mi). Formerly the colony of Spanish Guinea,its post-independence name refers to its location near both the Equator and in the African region of Guinea.

What is the Insular Region of Equatorial Guinea?

The insular region consists of the islands of Bioko(formerly Fernando P&#243;) in the Gulf of Guinea and Annob&#243;n,a small volcanic island which is the only part of the country south of the equator. Bioko Island is the northernmost part of Equatorial Guinea and is the site of the country's capital,Malabo.

What are the two parts of Equatorial Guinea?

Equatorial Guinea consists of two parts,an insular and a mainland region. The insular region consists of the islands of Bioko (formerly Fernando P&#243;) in the Gulf of Guinea and Annob&#243;n,a small volcanic island which is the only part of the country south of the equator.

Where is the capital of Equatorial Guinea?

Bioko Island is the northernmost part of Equatorial Guinea and is the site of the country's capital,Malabo. The Portuguese-speaking island nation of S&#227;o Tom&#233; and Pr&#237;ncipe is located between Bioko and Annob&#243;n. The mainland region,R&#237;o Muni,is bordered by Cameroon to the north and Gabon to the south and east.

How many regions does Equatorial Guinea have?

As observed on the physical map above,Equatorial Guinea in west-central Africa has twodistinct regions,a mainland region,and an insular region. The country has a total land area of 28,051 sq. km. The mainland of Equatorial Guinea begins on a narrow coastal plain,edged by mangrove swamps.

How many islands are in Equatorial Guinea?

It consists of R&#237;o Muni (also known as Continental Equatorial Guinea),on the continent,and five islands(known collectively as insular Equatorial Guinea): Bioko (formerly Fernando Po),Corisco,Great Elobey (Elobey Grande),Little Elobey (Elobey Chico),and Annob&#243;n (Pagalu). Bata is the administrative capital of the mainland.
