Can you recycle a battery?

Reduce fire risk and save precious resources by recycling your batteries. Common household batteries include lithium-ion button batteries from watches, hearing aids, etc., as well as standard barrel-type batteries (AAs, AAAs and so on). You must recycle these household batteries at dedicated battery collection points.

What happens if you throw away used batteries?

When batteries end up at landfill sites, the chemicals and hazardous materials from the battery contaminate the landfill site, contributing to air, water, and soil pollution. Batteries contain valuable, raw materials that can be recycled and reused to create new products.

How do I dispose of a battery?

Simply take any batteries which you need to dispose of and place them into the battery bank. They will then be safely removed and taken away to be recycled by local authorities. Some people do not have time to drop their batteries at their local authorities, or may simply prefer to have their unwanted batteries collected from their home.
